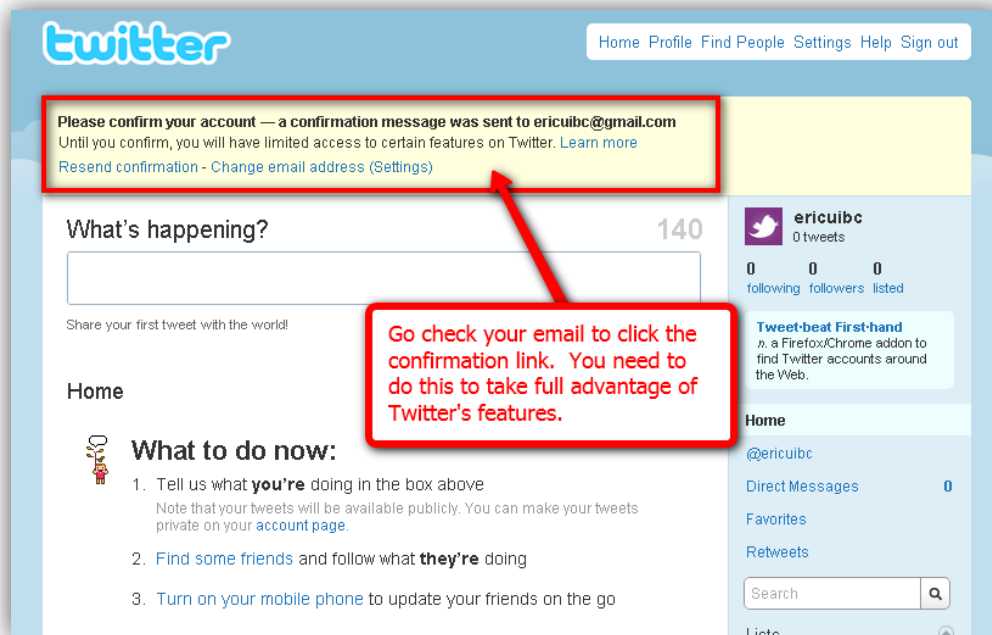
This is the last step for anyone we've missed. Search for a username, first name, last name, or business name.

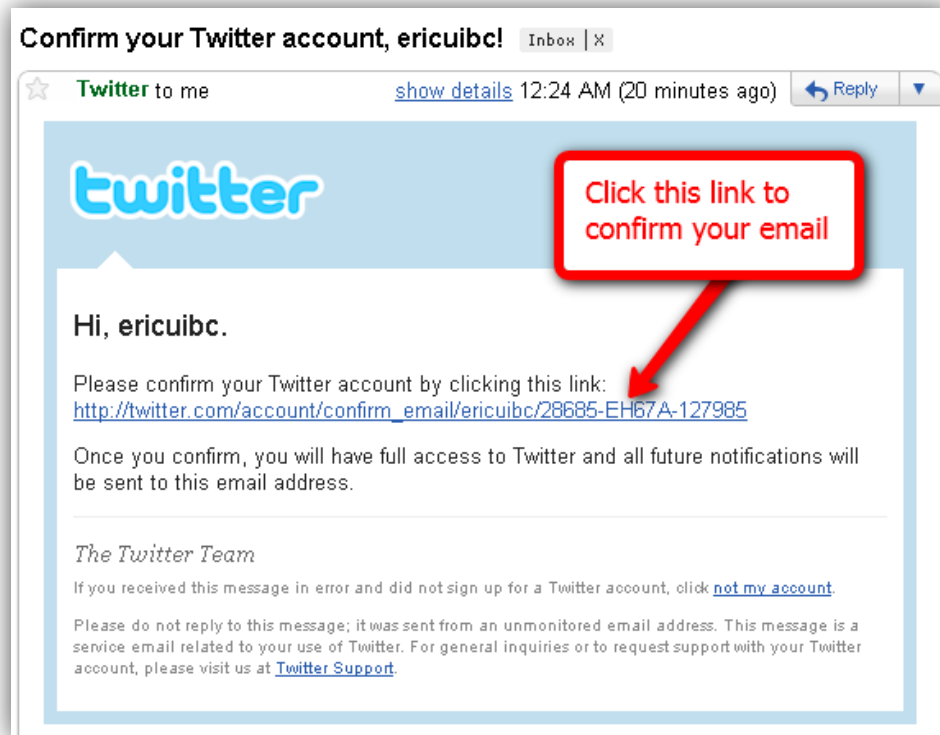
